
This has reference to your RTI application dated 01-07-2014 received on 11.07.2014. The point wise reply related to this CPIO is as under:-

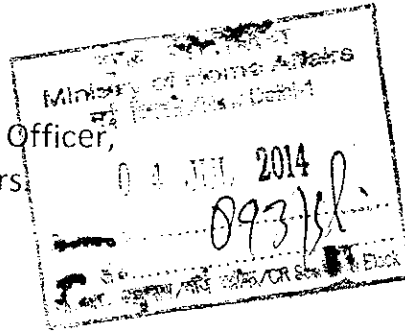

**Sub: Furnishing of information u/s 6 of Right to Information Act, 2005.**

Sir,

A few years ago when Miss Mayawati was Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, she, with the approval of the State Assembly, had forwarded a proposal for bifurcation of State of Uttar Pradesh into four states for proper governance, as she felt that it was not possible to govern such a big State justifiably. To the best of my knowledge, the said proposal was not approved and was rejected by the Central Government. In this connection please furnish the following information:-

1. The reason on the basis of the U.P. Government had proposed the division of State.
2. The reasons recorded by the Central Government for rejection of proposal sent by the Uttar Pradesh Government.
3. Copy of the relevant Resolution passed or note recorded for such rejection may kindly be provided.
4. Is there any proposal for the present Central Government to divide the Uttar Pradesh State into two or three portions if so, the proposal initiated in this regard may kindly be advised.

1. What were the favourable reasons recorded by the Chief Minister of Delhi for bifurcation of Corporation into four portions.
2. The reasons recorded by the Central Government for acceptance of the proposal.
3. A copy of resolution or note recorded for approval of said division may be provided.

It is requested that the requisite information may be furnished within 30 days as required under Section 7 of the Right to Information Act, 2005.
