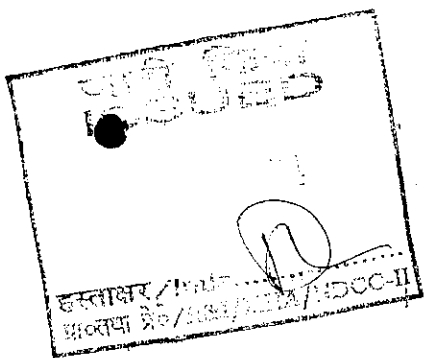

CITIZENS CHARTER IN RESPECT OF BORDER MANAGEMENT DIVISION

Mandate:

The Border Management Division deals with all matters relating to the Management of India's land borders with neighbouring Countries viz. Indo-Pakistan Border, Indo-Bangladesh Border, Indo-China Border, Indo-Myanmar Border, Indo-Nepal Border and Indo-Bhutan Border, as well as Coastal Borders including island territories of Andaman & Nicobar Islands and Lakshadweep etc. This includes putting in place the developmental activities in the border areas through the Border Areas Development (BADP) Programme.

Vision:

Security and sanctity of India's land and Sea Borders with a view to preserve India's integrity and sovereignty.

Mission:

- To put in place a multi-pronged approach for Border Guarding and Policing.
- To put in place effective infrastructure on our land border and the coastline like construction of Border Out Posts, fencing, border roads, floodlighting, marine police stations etc.
- To carry out development activities in the border areas through the Border Area Development Programme (BADP).
- To check infiltration and illegal activities along the borders.
- To promote and facilitate trade with neighbouring countries through development of Integrated Check Posts (ICPs) and border haats.

The main functional areas of BM Division are as under:-

- All matters relating to the management of Indo-Pakistan, Indo-Bangladesh, Indo-Myanmar, Indo-China, Indo-Nepal and Indo - Bhutan Borders.
- Matters relating to fencing and floodlighting of some of these land borders viz. Indo-Bangladesh, Indo-Pakistan and Indo-Myanmar Border.
- Strengthening of border guarding and policing, surveillance and patrolling along India's land borders.
- Creation of infrastructure including construction of motorable roads, provision of communication facilities etc along India's land borders.

- Providing MHA's inputs in regard to the demarcation of India's land borders in various sectors.
- Survey of Boundary Pillars in certain sectors of India's land borders.
- Matters relating to border trade with neighboring countries such as Myanmar, Bangladesh, Nepal and Bhutan etc.
- Matters relating to Indian enclaves along the Indo-Bangladesh Border.
- All matter relating to implementation of Border Areas Development Programme, (BADP).
- Overall supervision of Land Ports Authority of India (LPAI), the agency set up with the task of development of Integrated Check Posts (ICPs) i.e. Land Ports along India's land border.
- All matters relating to India's coastal borders including the island territories of Andaman & Nicobar Island and Lakshadweep etc.
- Strengthening of Coastal policing, surveillance and patrolling.
- Creation of infrastructure in the Coastal Belt.
- Matters relating to Island Possessions of India.
- Composite strategy defining complementary roles of the respective State Government and the Centre in matters of Coastal Security.
- General Coordination of all aspects of Border Management.

The Land Ports Authority of India (LPAI) is an autonomous body functioning under the control of BM Division. LPAI has been mandated with the task of developing Integrated Check Posts (ICPs) i.e. the Land Ports along India's land borders.

The Schemes administered by the BM Division are being operated through the various Central Agencies and State Government. BM Division does not handle any subject involving "direct public dealing".



SC threatens to stay appointment for tribunals

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Monday threatened to stay appointment of retired judges to hundreds of tribunals across the country, blaming the Centre's lethargy in responding to the court's repeated suggestions to bring uniformity in their appointment process and service conditions.

A bench of Justices G S Singhvi and C Nagappan pointed out the glaring disparity in the appointment process, tenure and service conditions of retired high court and Supreme Court judges chosen for tribunals and said since nothing much was done for a year, "we are inclined to stay all appointment of retired judges to tribunals".

Picking out Armed Forces Tribunal, National Commission for Dispute Redressal and National Green Tribunal as examples, the bench said, "The disparity in service conditions results in compromising the dignity of the judges. Everyone tried to get a post which has five-year term. That compromises the dignity. Let this be stopped till Parliament considers the proposal for uniform tenure."

Additional solicitor general Paras Kuhad said the Prime Minister had considered the apex court's order and had constituted a Group of Ministers (GoM) in March to formulate amendments needed to bring in uniformity in appointment, tenure and service conditions for retired judges appointed to tribunals.

"The GoM has drafted the proposal. It has been sent to 52 ministries, of which 35 have responded. The GoM is meeting shortly to take into account the responses and

Then a note would be prepared on this issue for the consideration of the Cabinet. It is a democratic process," Kuhad said.

The bench said, "True, the democratic process takes years together. But we just want to know a definite timeframe, which the government is unable to give. That is why we want to stop appointment of retired judges to tribunals till the time government brings in uniformity."

Finding himself in an inextricable situation, Kuhad sought a day's time from the bench to get instructions on the outer limit within which the uniformity stressed by the apex court about tribunals could be made a reality.

The bench agreed to give time to the government till Tuesday and recorded that the ASG "requests for a day's time to ascertain whether Cabinet will be able to consider GoM recommendations within a specified time".
