Sir,

I am directed to refer to the subject and to say that PMI to UN has confirmed the selection of following 06 (Six) Police Officers for their deployment to UNFICYP (Cyprus) :-

2. The above officers are required to be deployed to UNFICYP on **13th March, 2016.**

3. The officers should bring the following: -

- **CASH:** Police officers must bring sufficient cash (USD) to sustain one (1) week during the induction (**USD \$ 100 per day**). Officers can't expect to receive MSA on the day of arrival and need to be able to pay for food and hotel.
- The MSA payments, including the final one are hindered with the lack of required national banking details of the UN Police Officers back home. During the check-in, UN Police officers must provide the following details of bank accounts in their own countries :
 - Account Name
 - Account Number
 - Account Type(Checking or Saving)
 - Bank Name
 - SWIFT code
 - IBAN number (if available)
 - Bank address, including city and country.

- **Vaccination Certificate** : Yellow Fever vaccination is mandatory and proof of immunisation must be produced at entry for all travellers.
- **In-Mission test in Language & Driving** – Police officers(s) must have at least two years recent driving experience, and must be in possession of valid national or international civilian driving licenses. Police Officers must present their valid national driving licenses upon arrival in the mission area. The license should be valid during their service. The Police Officers are subject to an In-mission assessment in driving skills and English Language if they have not been cleared by a UN SAAT team. It is further mentioned that if such officer(s) fails such assessments and it appears that they has not passed previously SAAT, they will be repatriated at their own expense. Govt of India will not bear such expenses.
- **Online courses:** Please be advised that following online courses are mandatory for the newcomers, and certificates will be needed for the check-in formalities upon their arrival. Certificates must be printed upon completion of courses, if a printer is not available, all staff may be able to log-on at one of the Mission Computers to print the certificates upon arrival (**links given below**)

- The original receipt certifying depositing of his personal passport with the issuing authority in case of any passport held earlier.
- NOC/relieving order and Disciplinary/Vigilance clearance from his department at the time of reporting at National UN CIVPOL Centre.
- Recommended clothing & equipment.
- Any officer fails to accept the offer for appointment will be debarred for 03 years for further deployment/detailment with any UN assignments /Foreign courses.

4. The UN only pays subsistence allowance during the period of deployment within UN Mission area. The pay and allowances are to be paid by the lending authority. The officers may also be allowed to retain Government accommodation/telephone etc., if any held by them.

5. It must be ensured that the above police officers have rendered 08 years of police service including training period and are clear from vigilance angle. They have to compulsorily get the uniform and bear the cost of uniform from their personal saving. They are entitled to carry 100 Kg. total baggages, including hand/Cabin baggage.

6. It is, therefore, requested that the above officers may be relieved to report to the Commandant, National UN CIVPOL Centre, 22nd Bn ITBP by **01st March, 2016** to complete their travel formalities.



1. The Police Division is pleased to inform you that six (6) police officers from India have been cleared for deployment to UNFICYP. Attached you will find 3 Deployment Tracking documents for six officers. The recommended date of arrival at the mission is 13 March 2016 which is tentative and depends on the travel arrangements.
2. UNFICYP Travel Unit will initiate travel arrangements for the officer. We would be grateful if the internal administrative and logistic formalities for the deployment are expedited.
3. **CASH:** Police officers must bring sufficient cash (USD) to sustain one (1) week during the induction (we suggest at least US \$100 per day). Officer(s) can't expect to receive MSA on the day of arrival and need to be able to pay for food and hotel. The MSA payments, including the final one are hindered with the lack of required national banking details of the UN Police Officers back home. During the check-in, UN Police officers must provide the following details of bank accounts in their own countries: Account Name, Account Number, Account type (checking or Saving); Bank Name, SWIFT code, IBAN number (if available) bank Address, including city and country.
4. **VACCINATION CERTIFICATE:** Yellow Fever vaccination is mandatory and proof of immunization must be produced at entry for all travellers.

5. **IN-MISSION TEST IN LANGUAGE & DRIVING:** Police officer(s) must have at least two years recent driving experience, and must be in possession of valid national or international civilian driving licenses. Police officers must present their valid national driving licences upon arrival in the mission area. The license should be valid during their service.

6. The Police Division wishes to reiterate that police officer(s) are subject to an In-mission assessment in driving skills and English Language if they have not been cleared by a UN SAAT team. Please be advised that if such officer(s) fails such assessments and it appears that they had not passed previously SAAT, they will be repatriated at the expense of his/their Government. Alternately, if they had successfully passed SAAT tests earlier, only their driving skills will be re-examined.

7. **ONLINE COURSES:** Please be advised that the following online courses are mandatory for the newcomers, and certificates will be needed for the check-in formalities upon their arrival. Certificates must be printed upon completion of courses, if a printer is not available, all staff may be able to log-on at one of the Mission computers to print the certificates upon arrival (links given below):
