Subject: UNMISS: Deployment of Three (03) Female Police Officers for Deployment to UNMISS

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the subject and to say that PMI to UN has confirmed the selection of following officers for their further deployment to UNMISS in South Sudan:-

- (i) Ms Gurjeet Kaur, Inspector, UT Chandigarh
- (ii) Ms Surekha Pratap Dugge, Asstt Comnr, Maharashtra
- (iii) Ms Indra Namdeo, SI, MP
- 2. The above officers are required to be deployed to UNMISS on 18th January, 2015
- 3. The officer should bring the following:
 - Travel arrangement: The new incoming officers should arrive in Entebbe, Uganda, for 1 week pre-deployment induction training. They will proceed to UNMISS (Juba) by UN flight after the completion of the induction training. It is highly recommended to dispatch the accompanying luggage to Juba as the luggage transportation capacity from Entebbe to Juba is limited.
 - ➤ VISA: Please be advised that at the moment, no entry visa is required for the incoming UN Staff.
 - ➤ CASH: Police officers must bring sufficient cash (USD) to sustain one (1) week during the induction in Juba (USD \$ 100 per day). Officers can't expect to receive MSA on the day of arrival and need to be able to pay for food and hotel.
 - Fragmentation vest & helmet: With reference to the guidelines for UN Police Officers on assignment with peace keeping operations must bring a fragmentation vest and Kevlar helmet.
 - ➤ Vaccination Certificate Yellow Fever vaccination is mandatory and proof of immunisation must be produced at entry for all travellers.

- Malaria: Malaria Prophylaxis is required.
- In-Mission test in Language & Driving Police Officers must be in procession of valid national civilian driving licences that have at least two years validity period. Police Officers must present their valid national driving licences upon arrival in the mission area. Incoming Police Officers are subject to in-mission assessment in driving skills and English Language if they have not been cleared by a UN SAAT team. If any of them fail such assessments, they will be repatriated at their own expense. Alternatively, if they had successfully passed SAAT tests earlier, only their driving skills will be re-examined.
- Online courses: Please be advised that the following online courses are mandatory for the newcomers, and certificates will be needed for check-in formalities upon their arrival. Certificates must be printed upon completion of courses, if a printer is not available, all staff may be able to log-on at one of the mission computers to print the certificates upon arrival in Entebbe (links given below)

- The original receipt certifying depositing of his personal passport with the issuing authority in case of any passport held earlier.
- ➤ Relieving order issued by the **HOME DEPARTMENT** at the time of reporting at National UN CIVPOL Centre.
- > Original Official Passport.
- > Recommended clothing & equipments as per the guide list.
- Any officer fails to accept the offer for appointment will be debarred for 03 years for further deployment/detailment with any UN assignments /Foreign courses.
- 4. The UN only pays subsistence allowance during the period of deployment within UN Mission area. The pay and allowances are to be paid by the lending authority. The officers may also be allowed to retain Government accommodation/telephone etc., if any held by them.

- 5. It must be ensured that the above police officers have rendered 08 years of police service including training period and are clear from vigilance angle. They have to compulsorily get the uniform and bear the cost of uniform from their personal saving. They are entitled to carry 100 Kg. total baggages, including hand/Cabin baggage.
- 6. It is, therefore, requested that the above officers may be relieved to report to the Commandant, National UN CIVPOL Centre, 22nd Bn ITBP, Opposite Batra Hospital, New Delhi by **06th January**, **2015** to complete their travel formalities.

- 1. Please be informed that three (3) Indian female police officers have been finally cleared for deployment to the UN Mission in the Republic of South Sudan (UNMISS). Deployment list is attached herewith. Recommended date of arrival at the mission is 18 January 2015.
- 2. Please be noted that new arrivals can be received by the Mission only during the weekends, hence if arrival of the above mentioned officers has to be postponed, the formal notification should be forwarded to the Police Division without any delay. New date(s) of arrival will be communicated with the Permanent Mission in due course. Arrival in the Mission without coordination with the Police Division must not be practiced.
- 3. Entebbe Travel Unit will issue the travel authorization and e-tickets and make all travel arrangements. We would be grateful if you could expedite the internal administrative and logistic formalities for the deployment.
- 4. TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS: The new incoming officers should arrive in Entebbe, Uganda, for I-week pre-deployment induction training. They will proceed to UNMISS (Juba) by UN flight after the completion of the induction training. It is highly recommended to dispatch the accompanying luggage to Juba as the luggage transportation capacity from Entebbe to Juba is limited.
- 5. VISA: Please be advised that at the moment, no entry visa is required for the incoming UN staff.
- 6. CASH: Police officers must bring sufficient cash (USD) to sustain one (1) week during the induction in Juba (we suggest US \$100 per day). Officers can't expect to receive MSA on the day of arrival and need to be able to pay for food and

hotel.

- 7. FRAGMENTATION VEST & HELMET: With reference to the guidelines for UN police officers on assignment with peace keeping operations and to the equipment list for police officers, we must stress that police officers must bring a fragmentation vest and Kevlar helmet.
- 8. <u>VACCINATION CERTIFICATE</u>; Yellow Fever vaccination is mandatory and proof of immunization must be produced at entry for all travellers.
- MALARIA: Malaria Prophylaxis is required. Please see the Guidelines for UN
 police officers on assignment with peace keeping operations and the Travel
 Advisory which is attached to the travel authorization.
- 10. <u>IN-MISSION TEST IN LANGUAGE & DRIVING:</u> Police officers must be in possession of valid national civilian driving licenses that have at least two years validity period. Police officers must present their valid national driving licences upon arrival in the mission area.

The Police Division wishes to remind the Permanent Mission that incoming police officers are subject to in-mission assessment in driving skills and English Language if they have not been cleared by a UN SAT/SAAT team. Please be advised that if any of them fails such assessments he/she will be repatriated at the expense of the national Government. Alternately, if he/she had successfully passed SAT tests earlier, only his/her driving skills will be re-examined. The officers, who return to the mission area within the 24-month period after their departure from that mission, are considered as those SAT/SAAT cleared.

11. ONLINE COURSES: Please be advised that the following online courses are mandatory for the newcomers, and certificates will be needed for the check-in formalities upon their arrival. Certificates must be printed upon completion of courses, if a printer is not available, all staff may be able to log-on at one of the Mission computers to print the certificates upon arrival (links given below):
