I am directed to draw the recommendations/observations of the 237th Report of the Department-related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Home Affairs on the subject "Police-Training, Modernisation and Reforms."

One of the recommendation of the committee (para 4.4.4.) is as under: 2.

"Dual system vs Police Commissionerate System- The Committee notes that some States in the country have created multiple police commisionerates in their States, while some States having sizeable populations do not have any police commisionerate. The Committee is of the view that police commissionerate system leads to faster decisionmaking to solve urban-centric issues. With the growing number of cities with a millionplus population, the Commissionerate system would be a better option to manage for management of law and order problems and complex issues. The Committee recommends that the MHA may advise States to consider establishing police commissionerate system in cities having more than 10 lakh population as recommended by Mooshahary Committee."

It is therefore, requested that necessary action may be taken on the aforesaid recommendation of the Committee.
