Dear Justice Misra,

The Citizen's Justice Committee (CJC) has
filed on 31.3.1986 before the Honourable Commission
its submissions pertaining to the matter of the
continued presence and participation of CJC in the
proceedings of the Commission.

In view of the discussion which took place
yesterday between Your Lordship and Mr. Phoolka, and
out of deference to certain observations which you
were pleased to make during the course of the
discussion, an emergent meeting of the CJC was
convened yesterday evening.

After deep and careful reconsideration of the
matter, CJC regretfully finds itself unable to alter
its previous decision as set out in the said
submissions.

CJC would like to make it absolutely clear
that its decision and the said submissions filed by it
do not in any manner imply lack of personal confidence
in Your Lordship or any mark of disrespect for the
Commission.

For reasons already stated in the said submissions CJC is of the view that the procedure adopted and followed by the Commission has rendered its continued presence and participation ineffective and pointless.

The Commission decided to make a local inspection of two places within Bokaro Steel City area with a view to appreciating evidence recorded by it. Accordingly, accompanied by the Secretary to the Commission as also the Investigating Agency, the Commission visited between 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. today, Dashmesh Nagar area where the kacha-pucca construction housing the Gurudwara and a row of kacha houses (jhuggis) where Sikhs were residing had been totally demolished. There is hardly any trace of construction on the area left now. This place is surrounded by jhuggis and small pucca construction which are said to be unauthorised. The place is not conveniently approachable on account of lack of road facility and is in fact somewhat cut off from the main link.

The Commission next went to the Gurudwara in Sector 2 on which an attack had been made. During the riots a lot of victims and Sikhs who were afraid of their safety had taken shelter here.

A memorandum be left on record for consideration in due course.

Deponent's husband husband's cousin and two others were killed and burnt by miscreant. Deponent was assaulted. Criminal case is pending trial.
2.	2585/85; Smt. Parsanni Kaur, widow of Sardar Bahadur Singh, r/o. Qr. No. P-III/119, Sultanpuri, New Delhi.	House looted and burnt, husband and three sons alleged to have been killed and burnt.	Husband and three sons were killed during riots. The husband and the son had gone to gurdwara and appear to have been killed on the way. So far as remaining two sons are concerned, the allegation in the affidavit is correct. Most of the culprits named in the affidavit appear to have been properly implicated and they have been chargesheeted and trial is pending.
3.	2735, 2736, 2737/85; Monish Sanjay Suri; son of late D.H. Suri, Staff Reporter, Indian Express.	Common deponent filed three affidavits.	He is not a victim and deposed what he saw. The allegation against Jatav supporting local Congress I leaders is not established though the impression that local Congress I leaders had come out to support the rioters is largely correct.
4.	2292/85; Smt. Barfi Bai, widow of Ishwar Singh, r/o. C-83-C, Tilak Vihar, New Delhi.	Burning of the house and killing of her husband and son and burning them to death. Allegation made also that the police was in league with the rioters.	Allegation of killing of husband and son and burning them prima facie correct. Allegation regarding arson in the house and killing of the son by pushing them into that fire for burning them to death prima facie established. Police participation not accepted though there was some material for their indifference.

5. 2297/85; Smt. Gurdeep Kaur, w/o. Mathur Singh, r/o. 32/117-118, Trilokpuri, Delhi
Killing of husband and two sons; Assault on her person as a result of which fracture of left hand; indifference of police.
Deponent's husband & two sons were killed, house looted; as a result of assault on deponent her left hand fractured. Suggestion of abatement of police not found.
6. 2690/85; Smt. Guddi Kaur, widow of Shri Jarnail Singh, r/o. Jhuggi Area, Sultanpuri, Delhi
Husband assaulted and later killed. It is further alleged that his father-in-law also killed. Husband was said to have been working in middle East countries and had lot of valuable goods in the house which was looted.
Killing of husband and father-in-law established. Similarly, burning of house accepted. Implication of some of the culprits in the affidavit is also correct. Presence of police not established by evidence. The circumstances indicated that some police were in the area and at the spot.
7. 2419/85; Smt. Buri Bai widow of Sh. Santa Singh, r/o. A-4/88, BDA Plats, Sultanpuri New Delhi
Husband and son were alleged to have been killed
Killing of husband and son of the deponent is correct. Allegation of looting of house not established.
8. 2610/85; Smt. Hora Rakhi, widow of Sh. Baroo Singh, r/o. House No. 452, Block 11, Kalyanpuri, Delhi.
Allegation of looting of house in the presence of police.
The allegation regarding looting of the house established. So far as presence of police at the time of incident is concerned, there is no evidence to accept the suggestion.
9. 2425/85; Smt. Surender Kaur, widow of late Shri Jeet Singh, r/o. E-3/477, 478, Sultanpuri, New Delhi
Husband killed and burnt; House looted
Husband was A.S.I. in the police but at the time of killing he was at home. Killing and burning of the dead body established. Looting of house is true. Police have launched the prosecution for murder and allied offences against many persons named in the affidavit.

10. 159/85; Smt. Tahni Devi wife of Sh. Haru Singh; r/o. 32/88, Trilokpuri New Delhi. Allegation gurudwara was burnt, several sikhs were killed. Husband received grievous injuries which have now lamed him. Allegation found to be true.
11. 140/85; 2283/85; Smt. Charanjit Kaur wife of Sardar Surinder Singh, r/o. K-Block, 1499/1500, Jahangirpuri, Delhi. Two affidavits have been filed by the same deponent. Deponent sustained loss of property worth Rs. 60,000/- on account of looting. The allegation regarding looting of property found to be true. The allegation of killing of truck driver not established.
12. 2352/85; Smt. Kulwant Kaur, wife of Manak Singh, r/o. B-52, Gulab Bagh, New Delhi. Husband and two sons were hair-shaved by barber Pyare Lal accompanying the mob; sustained loss of property worth value at Rs. 50,000/-; police refused to record FIR implicating certain Congress I persons. Facts alleged generally accepted to be true.
13. 2517/85; Smt. Miranjan Kaur, widow of Sardar Amarjeet Singh, r/o. C-32, Janta Flats, Garhi, East of Kailash, New Delhi. Husband and father-in-law killed. Allegation of rape and assault of deponent. Allegation of looting, arson and killing of her husband and father-in-law accepted to be true. The implication of two accused persons is also correct. Allegation of rape though shown in the affidavit is denied by the deponent during investigation and not also independently accepted. Allegation of assault resulting in injuries leading to hospitalisation is true.
14. 2428/85; Miss P. L. Kaur, D/o. Late Sardar Joginder Singh r/o. F-7/324, Sultanpuri, New Delhi. Mass members of the mob attacked the house and looted the same and set it on fire. Deponent's father was killed. Facts generally accepted to be correct.

15. 2494/85; Smt. Barfi Kaur, wife of Sh. Laka Singh, r/o. F-4/48, Sultanpuri, Delhi. Killing of husband and looting of house; personal injuries. The looting of house is true. Allegation of killing of servant is not established. The allegation regarding killing of husband has not been established by acceptable evidence. The name of the husband is not in the killed persons which has now been verified.
16. 2574/85; Smt. Vidya Kaur wife of Sardar Sardul Singh, r/o. 30/461, Trilokpuri, New Delhi. Allegation of killing of husband; injuries caused to brother and burning of house. Looting and burning of house as also killing of brother is accepted. Police found to be inactive and failing to rise to the occasion.
17. 2711/85; Hamam Singh son of Sardar Jiwan Singh, r/o. 12-315, Palam Colony, Sadh Nagar, Gali No. 8, New Delhi. Police did not stop the miscreants; rather extended help to them for their criminal operation. Congress I leaders supported the mob. Pritam Singh his wife, son and a tenant and his wife were killed during the riot. Killing of the five people found. The persons named as the killers could not be pin pointed in the absence of positive material. Police did not interfere with the mob. Allegation of mob being led by Congress leaders not found.
18. 2539/85; Jaspal Singh widow of Lal Singh Wanda, r/o. 12-170, Sadh Nagar, Gali No. 9, Palam Colony, New Delhi. Shop and house looted and damaged; husband and two sons killed. All allegations accepted. The statement in the affidavit that the Army did not help was a vague one.
19. 2360/85; Sukhdeo Singh, s/o. Sardar Kesar Singh, r/o. E-16, Kiran Garden, New Delhi. Alleged that Suresh Kumar, Assistant Commissioner of C.R.P. refused to render help on the ground that it was no part of his duty to do so. Witnessed looting and burning of houses and property of Sikhs. Allegation of looting and burning etc. So far as the allegation against Suresh Kumar is concerned, not established.

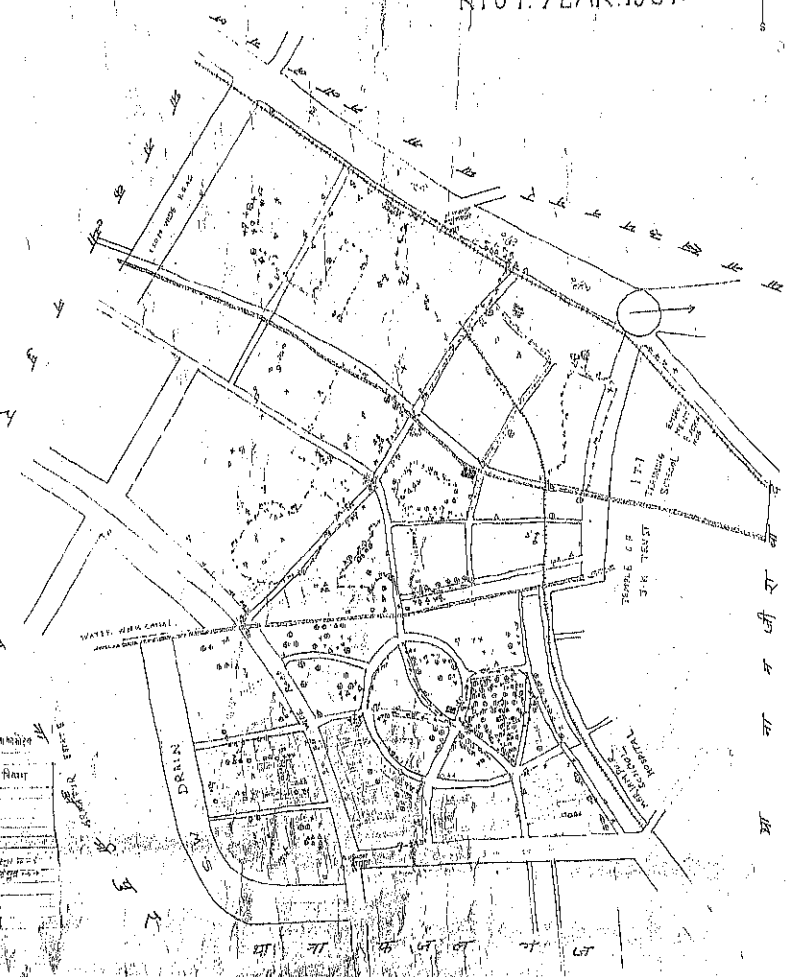

APPENDIX " 11 "Conclusion of Investigating Agency with reference to Capt. Bareth's statement.

Dy.S.P. Shri Narayana was asked to collect further details about statement of Capt. B.Bareth. It is found that by and large there is a similarity in the statement of Capt. Bareth and statement of Mrs. Tomar, the then City Magistrate, Kanpur and incharge of military column, deputed to maintain law and order on 1.11.1984 in Kidwai-nagar area. It is also noticed from the statements of both the officers, City Magistrate and Captain that D.M. himself remained at the spot and appeared to be hesitant to take any firm action. It appears, from the facts collected that his conduct was not above board in tackling the situation. On the one hand he asked his personal security men to fire at the mob but on the other hand he has not brought the army people to the forefront. It appears that Capt. Bareth insisted for firing telling that mob should be dispersed first. Mrs. Tomar, City Magistrate also was not in a position to do anything since a senior officer, (D.M.) was present at the spot who was talking to the members of the crowd. It may be a fact that situation was tense through out the city of Kanpur but attempt should have been made by contacting control room to strengthen the force position at that particular place, to rescue sikhs.

Another aspect of the situation was that inspite of repeated appeals and request sikhs members of the family particularly head of the family, continued firing. They were requested/advised to come out to go to police station but all fell flat, such adamant attitude of sikhs people certainly might have irritated authorities and local gentlemen to leave them at the mercy of God. Moreover, continuous firing by sardars (sikh persons) fomented anger of the mob.

Besides all, Harmail Singh was stubborn and over confident to protect himself and others, owing to Harmail Singh's audacity mob got swollen and fury of the mob

mounted to a height. Ultimately, D.M. also lost patience and moved away from the spot with force to see the situation elsewhere.

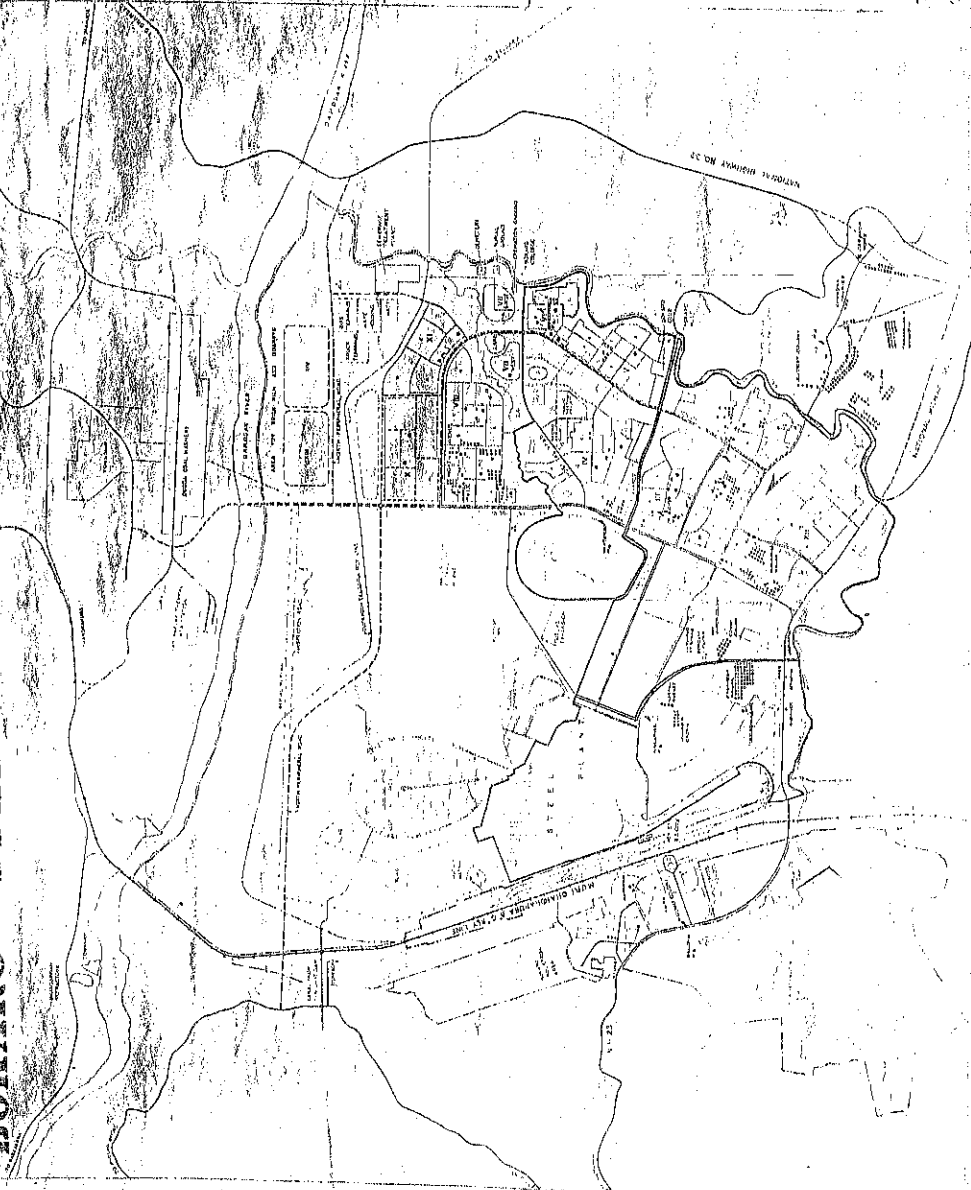

Dear Sri Gupta,

Please refer to your D.O. letter No.1/86/KPR/MCI(J), dated 8th May 1986, regarding measures relating to rehabilitation of riot victims discussed with the Hon'ble Chairman during his visit to Lucknow on 12th April 1986. Please also refer to your telex dated 19.5.1986, conveying the orders of the Commission of the same date.

2. The State Government had agreed during these discussions to consider such cases as exceptional in the matter of providing relief and rehabilitation in which the Commission was satisfied that they were especially hard cases and deserved exceptional treatment and recommended as such to the State Government.

3. The first such case recommended by the Commission to the State Government was that of Smt. Harminder Kaur in respect of whom the Commission was pleased to pass an order dated 12.4.1986 but a copy of which order was provided to the State Government only vide your letter No. 8.110/35-MR(J), dated 28th April 1986 which was received in my office on 1.5.1986. This case is being processed expeditiously.

4. The second such case is that of Smt. Satwant Kaur in which your letter dated 14.5.1986 was personally received by Shri Naresh Dayal, Special Secretary, Home, Government of U.P., at your office at New Delhi on 14.5.1986. This is also being processed.

5. At its sitting at Lucknow on 12.4.1986, the Commission had also directed the Home Secretary, U.P. to consider the transfer of Inspectors and Sub-Inspectors of Police who were posted at Kanpur during the riots and that if it was not possible to transfer them out of Kanpur, they may be transferred to other Police Stations. I would like to inform the Commission that this has been done.

6. The Commission had also directed the Home Secretary that the State Government may give financial aid to next of kin of four persons reported missing from Kanpur during the riot and if considered necessary a bond may be taken from them that if it is proved that they did not die in the riots the money would be returned. Accordingly, instructions were sent to District Magistrate, Kanpur on 25.4.1986, and the report received from District Magistrate, Kanpur, in the case of Shri Gurjit Singh who was reported to be missing after the riots, financial aid of Rs.20,000/- has been paid to next of kin and a bond has been executed by them.

7. In addition to the above case, five other cases of persons missing after the riots were reported to the District Magistrate, Kanpur (City). These cases are of (1) Shri Bhagat Singh s/o. Shri Narayan Singh, (2) Shri Joginder Singh, (3) Shri Partap Singh, (4) Shri Jagir Singh, and (5) Shri Raghbir Singh Bhatia. At the district level, these claims were not substantiated as per report dated 8.5.1986 and in some cases it was found that the person concerned died well before the riots and in others the person concerned never resided at the address given. However, further details of these cases are being ascertained by the State Government.

8. As is evident from the above, the State Government are doing every thing possible to comply with the directions given by the Commission and there is no question of any refusal to comply with the assurances given before the Commission. The above information may kindly be conveyed to the Hon'ble Chairman.

Dear Sri Gupta,

Kindly refer to the Commission's Order dated 2.5.1986 with regard to the investigation of First Information Reports, lodged by victims of October-November, 1984 riots in Kanpur City. The State Government had been directed in this Order to inform the Commission of all the actions taken in this regard by 31st May, 1986. In this connection I would like to inform you that State Government has constituted a Committee of three persons, as directed by the Hon'ble Commission to sort out the cases appropriate for reinvestigation to supervise the re-investigation of the cases after obtaining the permission of the competent Court and thereafter to supervise the effective prosecution of the cases in Court. A copy of the Office Memorandum, issued in this respect is annexed.

2. I would like to inform you that the State Government has also constituted a Special Investigation Team, headed by a Deputy Superintendent of Police to re-investigate the cases, which are found appropriate for re-investigation by the Committee mentioned in the preceding paragraph. Copies of the orders, sent to the Director General of Police to appoint suitable investigating officers for this special Investigation Team, are also annexed.

3. The State Government has also issued directions to the District Magistrate, Kanpur (City) to re-examine the cases connected with the riots in which the accused have been granted bail by the Courts. In cases where there are sufficient grounds for moving the Courts for cancellation of bail, the District

administration has been instructed to do the same expeditiously. Copies of orders, issued to the District Magistrate, Kanpur (City) in this regard, are also annexed.

4. As will be apparent from the above, the State Government is taking urgent action to implement the directions of the Hon'ble Commission dated 2.5.1986. The State Government will also maintain close watch on the implementation of these directions so that it is ensured that they are implemented in letter and spirit.

Kindly refer to your D.O. letter of 22nd May, 1986 addressed to the Secretary to Lt. Governor, Delhi, enclosing therewith 103 applications of November, 1984, riot victims for employment. The position is as given below:-

- (1) Out of the total 103 applications, 69 have been forwarded for appointment to Directorate of Education, Punjabi Academy and Police Department for consideration for appointment on suitable posts.
- (2) The four cases, figuring on serial No.158 to 161, belong to a single family and our criteria is one job per family.
- (3) As regards rest of the 30 cases, bonafides of applications are being verified from the site.

Efforts are also being made by us to rehabilitate the widows in Government/Semi-Government organisation/departments. About 300 applications of riot affected widows have already been sent to various departments for their absorption. We hope a sizeable number of widows will receive their appointment letters soon. 8 Widows have already been appointed in Slum Department of ODA, Punjabi Academy and DESU.

Dear Shri Guptaji

Kindly refer to the case of 7 widows and one Shri Wazir Singh. I may mention that we have taken up the rehabilitation of the riot affected widows. In pursuance of a recent decision to absorb them in Government/Semi-Government organisation we have already sent cases of 300 widows to various departments for their employment. In addition to this NAYE is conducting training courses in tailoring and it is expected that many of the widows will be able to get employment in various industries. We also expect to start an electronic unit with the help of a voluntary organisation at Tilak Vihar which is expected to provide employment to about 60 widows. As far as the seven cases are concerned they are also being considered alongwith others for rehabilitation depending on the qualification and their willingness for a particular job or trade.

2. The case of Shri Wazir Singh at serial No.8 is not covered under the policy guidelines for allotment of ODA tenement. However, the case is being put up separately to LG for his kind consideration whether he can be given an out of turn allotment of an MIG flat at Dilshad Garden. Such matters are basically dealt by Delhi Development Authority where the case is being referred for putting it up to Lt. Governor who is also the Chairman of ODA.

Kindly refer to the cases of four widows sent by Mrs. Jatinder Kaur Lall vide her letter dated 31.5.86 to Hon'ble Justice R.N. Misra Commission of Inquiry. As far as the cases of Mrs. Gurmeet Kaur and Mrs. Devinder Kaur are concerned apparently their applications were not received by us. However, they are being approached to apply so that immediate allotment of living accommodation can be given to them. As far as the case of Mrs. Surjeet Kaur is concerned, she was given allotment on exchange basis while she wants on tenant basis. Unless she surrenders her house we cannot make allotment as per general policy followed by us so far.

2. Regarding the case of Mrs. Mohinder Kaur, as per available information she is not a riot affected widow. Her case, however, is being further examined and if she is found eligible she would be provided suitable accommodation.

Kindly refer to your D.O. letter No.185/86-MCI(J) dated 26-5-1986 addressed to the Secretary to Lt. Governor, Delhi, regarding 17 widows and 86 riot affected families living in Hari Nagar Relief Camp for allotment of quarters. The position has been got checked which is as follows.

2. Regarding 17 widows, 6 at serial No.1, 2, 3, 8, 11 and 12 have already been issued offer letters for allotment of tenements. One widow mentioned at serial No.10 has refused allotment. In 4 cases (serial No.5, 6, 13 and 14) the allotments were not made as they were not riot affected widows or had sold their own houses. These cases are, however, being reviewed. For the remaining 6 cases we have no record available whether they had applied for allotment to this office. These 6 widows are being approached to check up why they had not applied and whether they are interested in allotment.
3. As far as the list of 86 persons is concerned none of them is eligible as neither they were found during the survey conducted by us on 14th November, 1985 at Hari Nagar nor their names were included in the list of those who were staying in the camps. As such they are not eligible for allotment. Many of them might have come to Hari Nagar Camp with a view to get allotment.
