

Setting up of Counter Insurgency and Anti Terrorist Schools (CIATs) component of the Police Education & Training Scheme during XIth Five Year Plan.

During the 11th Plan period a scheme was planned to set up 20 CIAT Schools, four each in the States of Assam, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand and Orissa. In these Schools 75,000 police personnel will be trained for combating terrorism/naxalism. The training will be mainly outdoor therefore large scale permanent constructions would not be required. Most of the infrastructure will be temporary e.g. makeshift barracks, temporary sheds etc. The Ministry of Home Affairs would provide an amount of Rs.1.5 crores to each school for development of temporary infrastructure. The Ministry would also bear recurring expenditure towards honorarium to be paid to the trainers. The land for these schools would be provided by the concerned State Governments. They would also provide administrative support for running the CIAT Schools and necessary training equipments like weapons, ammunition, supporting manpower etc. BPR&D has already signed a MOU with each State to this effect.
