- Countering/Preventing Violent Extremism
- Conventional Arms
- Customs and Border Control
- Transport/Aviation Security
- Antiquities Trade

3. The selection process will include an interview by the UN and other assessment methods to evaluate a candidate's suitability.

It is requested that nomination of **One eligible and willing officer** of the rank DIG/IG along with the duly filled curricula vitae CV, including contact information may be forwarded to this Ministry by **11th September, 2017**. The Secretariat of the United Nations presents its compliments to the Permanent Missions of Member States to the United Nations and invites Member States to recommend qualified individuals to serve as experts on the Analytical Support and Sanctions Monitoring Team pursuant to resolutions 1526 (2004) and 2253 (2015) concerning ISIL (Da'esh), Al-Qaida and the Taliban and associated individuals and entities (hereafter "the Monitoring Team").

The Monitoring Team, which is comprised of ten experts, operates under the direction of the Security Council Committee pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999), 1989 (2011) and 2253 (2015) concerning ISIL (Da'esh), Al-Qaida and associated individuals, groups, undertakings and entities, and the Security Council Committee established pursuant to resolution 1988 (2011).

Nominations are sought for three positions on the Monitoring Team that will become vacant in January and February 2018 respectively. Recommended candidates should possess a minimum of **ten years** of progressively responsible experience in any of the below mentioned relevant areas of expertise and competence:

- Counter-terrorism, particularly combatting the financing of terrorism;
- Terrorism threat assessment;
- Countering/Preventing Violent Extremism;
- Conventional Arms;
- Customs and Border Control;
- Transport/Aviation Security;
- Antiquities trade.

The selection process will include an interview and other assessment methods to evaluate a candidate's suitability. Sanctions experts are selected on the basis of demonstrated expertise in the relevant area of work, experience and educational background, with due regard to equitable geographic representation and gender balance. English and French are the working languages of the United Nations. For this position, fluency in English is required; knowledge of Arabic is highly desirable.

Appointment duration is in accordance with the mandate of the expert panel established by the Security Council. Experts are hired as consultants in line with the United Nations' administrative instruction concerning consultants and individual contractors (ST/AI/2013/4).
