

QR/TDs of Belgian Shepherd Malinois Pups

1.	General Requirement BSM Pups are required for dual task of detection and patrol. The potential pup should be from either of the following sources:- a) From open market or any Established Police / Military Working Dog centres of foreign countries. b) From open market or any established Police / Military Working Dog centres of India.	To be ascertained by the BOOs. Firm to mention source in their tender documents.
2.	Belgian Shepherd Malinois Canine breed pups should be between 8 to 16 weeks. User agency should specify the age requirement at the time of indenting.	In case of local purchase, BOOs will ascertain the age of dog from KCI certificate or any other registered Kennel Clubs. Whereas, in case of import, firm to provide certificate from registered Organisation of the concerned Country to ascertain the age. In addition, dentition of animal and other age milestones will be determined by the Vet Officer. Firm to submit an undertaking at the time of tender that they will deliver the pups as per the QR requirements at the time of delivery. Age of pup should not be more than 16 weeks on the date of inspection of PDI.
3.	General appearance :- Well balanced dog, stands squarely on all fours and viewed from the side, the top line, four legs and hind legs closely approximate a square	It will be ascertained by BOOs by visual inspection during PDI. Firm to provide an Undertaking Certificate that they will provide breeding stock with conformance to these parameters during supply. Firm will submit such Undertaking Certificate in their tender documents.



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
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
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<p>The pedigree tree upto previous 3 generations should be provided by the vendor / supplier.</p> <p>The vendor / supplier should provide KCI registration / recognised breed registration agency certificate about Pedigree tree.</p>	<p>The BOOs should confirm this by checking the registration certificates of pups and those of Grand parents of the pups supplied.</p>
<p>5. Distinguishing characters:- The head is clean cut and strong without heaviness, overall size in proportion to the body. It shows alertness, attention and readiness for activity and gaze is intelligent and questioning. Eyes are brown, preferably dark brown, medium size, slightly almond shaped, not protruding. Eye rims are black. The ears approach the shape of an equilateral triangle and are stiff, erect, and in proportion to the head in size. The outer corner of the ear should not come below the centre of the eye. The top of the skull is flattened rather than rounded with the width approximately the same as the length but no wider. The stop is moderate. The muzzle is moderately pointed, avoiding any tendency to snippiness, and approximately equal in length to the top skull. The basic colouring is a rich fawn to mahogany, with black tips on the hairs giving an overlay appearance. The mask and ears are black. The coat should be comparatively short, straight, hard enough to be weather resistant, with dense undercoat.</p>	<p>It will be ascertained by BOOs by visual inspection during PDI. Firm to provide an Undertaking certificate that they will provide breeding stock with conformance to these parameters during supply. Firm will submit such Undertaking certificate in their tender documents.</p>
<p>6. Height, Weight and Colour:- (i) Height of dog should be proportionate to the age of the pup. (ii) Weight of dog should be proportionate to the age of the pup. (iii) Colour – Rich fawn to mahogany with black tips on the hairs giving an overlay appearance. The mask and ears are black.</p>	<p>(i) Height and weight of Pups will be assessed by the Vet Doctor and it should be proportionate to the age of the pup at the time of PDI. (ii) BOOs will confirm the colour during visual inspection at the time of PDI.</p>



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7.	The puppy should have right temperament and aptitude for inducting into PSK training.	The BOOs should conduct aptitude test of the puppy on following aspects :- a. Social attraction b. Following c. Restraint d. Social Dominance e. Elevation dominance f. Retrieving g. Touch sensitivity h. Sound sensitivity i. Sight sensitivity j. Stability As per the prescribed procedure (VOLHARD's Puppy Aptitude Test).
8.	Veterinary Examination:- The dog should be veterinary sound.	During PDI, the BOO will ascertain veterinary soundness of breeding stock.
9.	Vaccination and Miscellaneous Health Issues	Firm to provide an Undertaking certificate that they will provide breeding stock with conformance to these parameters during supply. Firm will submit such Undertaking certificate in their tender documents.
	i) The pedigree of previous three generations should be provided by vendor and user should compare and analyse with already held breeding stock to ensure that dogs are not in-bred in any way.	i) The firm will submit such verifiable certificates during PDI and BOO will ascertain it through records and through visual and physically inspection.



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<p>ii) The dog should be free from genetic diseases which comprises of hip dysplasia, elbow dysplasia, hereditary epilepsy and progressive retinal atrophy etc. The vendor should guarantee for minimum 6 (Six) months regarding any of the above mentioned genetic disorders and replace the dog with similar specifications in the event of any of these genetic abnormalities surfaces during this period. This replacement should be at the risk and freight of the supplier firm.</p>	<p>ii) In this regard, the firm will submit an undertaking certificate in their tender documents.</p>
<p>iii) The dog should be duly immunised against common canine infectious diseases and apparently free from infectious & contagious diseases which comprises of Canine Parvo, Distemper, Hepatitis, Leptospirosis, Corona, Para-influenza and Rabies.</p>	<p>iii) The firm will provide all such required immunisation reports and BOOs will check its authenticity during PDI. BOO will also inspect breeding stock physically to check such diseases during PDI.</p>
<p>iv) The dog should be free from any genital diseases like metritis, ovarian / uterine cysts, mastitis, vaginitis, pyometra in case of female dog and cryptorchidism, inflammation of testes, phimosis, paraphimosis, priapism in case of male dog. These dogs should also be free from any skin disorder like dermatitis, folliculitis, seborrhea, scabies, sarcoptic & demodectic mange, fleas, ticks infestation, tumour, granulomas, anal sac disease or any other fungal / bacterial infections.</p>	<p>iv) During PDI, the BOO will physically verify the dog for defects and can also carry out any other diagnostic examinations, if required.</p>
<p>v) The clinical and laboratory examination of the candidate dogs should be carried by the vendor within previous 14 days from the date of examination from an ISO 17025 / National or International accredited veterinary laboratory with regards to complete blood count (CBC), biochemistry profile with regards to liver and kidney function tests, lipid profile and heart worm test.</p>	<p>v) The firm will provide all such required lab reports during PDI and the board will ascertain its authenticity.</p>



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vi) Complete radiological examination for hip and elbow scores, chest radiographs and any other record to ensure that the dogs have not undergone any surgical intervention.	vi) The firm will provide all such required lab reports during PDI and the board will ascertain its authenticity.
vii) The dogs must comply with all mandatory quarantine norms of both exporting and importing countries.	vii) The firm will submit an undertaking certificate for same in their tender documents.

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
