MEA has informed about the invitation received from the UN for the TPP 2025 Stakeholders' Workshop, 24-26 June [Nairobi].

2. The Workshop, which is being organised by the Secretariat, with support from the Governments of Kenya and Switzerland, will be conducted in English and aims to:

- i. take stock of the TPP's achievements and progress to date;
- ii. strengthen relations among current and new partners as willing contributors of capabilities to United Nations peacekeeping and AU peace support operations, and contributors of expertise and other resources to the Programme;
- iii. review and improve TPP training curricula,
- iv. explore new TPP areas of contributions including closer partnerships with regional organisations in particular the African Union (AU),
- v. share information and best practices in identifying capability gaps and measuring performance, and
- vi. discuss ways to further develop TPP, including engagement with and between key partners.

3. Financial implications: While accommodation and catering will be provided by TPP, with support from the Workshop's host, Kenya, and co-chair, Switzerland, all participants are required to arrange their own international or domestic travel. Participants are also responsible for acquiring their own visa (www.etakenya.go.ke). During the Workshop, local transportation will be provided by Kenya to and from the TPP-provided accommodation.

3. No fixed slot from India is available. It is an open invitation for all members' states of UN. The candidates should have a broad experience of police service, and are selected to serve as a police officer in an international peace support operation. The recommended nominees by Government of India will be selected by the UN. The selection process considers a balance in professional and organizational backgrounds.

4. The nomination of eligible and suitable candidates in the rank of DySP/SP active in police service for the above said courses may be forwarded through proper channel to this

Ministry by 21st April 2025 along with the requisite documents duly signed and completed in all aspects as mentioned in Annexure-I & II. The nominations without Vigilance clearance and Cadre Clearance (for all Officers) from respective Ministries/Departments/State or UT/Organizations' shall be summarily rejected. Applications received through proper channel only i.e. through Home Department (State)/ approval of Head of Organization/ UT division in case of AGMUT cadre officers, will be entertained. **Applications received after the deadline specified i.e. 21.04.2025 will not be considered.**

6. The duly completed and signed registration form, along with a scanned copy of the participant's passport data page, Bio-data, HR certificate along with the forwarding letter including APAR/ACR gradings for the Last Five Years(Mandatory) of the nominated candidates are required to be submitted (PDF format only) through email at police2-un@mha.gov.in before the last date of submission of nominations as mentioned above.

7. Nominating governments/organizations are advised to submit a maximum of 03 nominations for the course. If more than 03 nominations are received, only the first 03 will be considered.

The Secretariat of the United Nations presents its compliments to the Permanent Mission of India to the United Nations and has the honour to refer to efforts to ensure that collaboration under the Triangular Partnerships Programme (TPP) continues to best meet the needs of United Nations peacekeeping.

The TPP is a training, capacity-building, and operational support programme administered by the Department of Operational Support (DOS) in which the UN works with Member States, with the expertise and resources, and Troop Contributing Countries (TCCs), in addressing gaps in military enabling capabilities needed by United Nations peacekeeping and African Union (AU) peace support operations. Key aspects of the TPP to date have involved the provision of training in heavy engineering, medical support and C4ISR (Command, Control, Communications, Computers, Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance) and camp security technologies to meet training needs of UN peacekeeping and TCCs. The triangular partnership framework has served to introduce telemedicine in several UN peace operations. The enclosed fact sheet provides more background information on achievements through the TPP in recent years.

With strong support and consultation with its partners, the Secretariat has now expanded its scope to provide training on counter-improvised explosive devices (C-IED) and is exploring further areas of work, such as environmental management, to further enhance the efficiencies and effectiveness of its impact through its training pillars.

This year, the Secretariat marks the 10th anniversary of the TPP. The upcoming Stakeholders' Workshop will serve to highlight TPP's successes over the course of its past 10 years of support to peacekeeping and, with its Stakeholders, collectively address opportunities for its next decade of work. The Secretariat wishes to invite India to nominate up to two participants to the Stakeholders' Workshop from 24-26 June 2025 at the International Peace Support Training Centre (IPSTC), with the Workshop taking place at the Humanitarian Peace Support School (HPSS), in Nairobi, Kenya. Member State representatives may be both from their Capital and/or from the Permanent Missions in New York. Kindly note that, due to administrative and financial constraints, the Workshop is only able to accommodate a limited number of participants.

The Workshop, which is being organised by the Secretariat, with support from the Governments of Kenya and Switzerland, will be conducted in English and aims to: i) take stock of the TPP's achievements and progress to date; ii) strengthen relations among current and new partners as willing contributors of capabilities to United Nations peacekeeping and AU peace support operations, and contributors of expertise and other resources to the Programme; iii) review and improve TPP training curricula, iv) explore new TPP areas of contributions including closer partnerships with regional organisations in particular the African Union (AU), v) share information and best practices in identifying capability gaps and measuring performance, and iv) discuss ways to further develop TPP, including engagement with and between key partners.

Participants are also responsible for acquiring their own visa (<u>www.etakenya.go.ke</u>).
