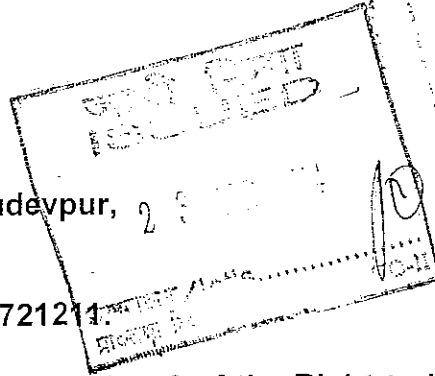

Sir,

I am directed to refer your application dated 9.4.2014 on the above mentioned subject.

2. As per provisions of the **Swatantrata Sainik Samman** Pension Scheme, 1980, sons of the freedom fighters are not eligible for grant of dependent family pension. Under the Scheme, for the purpose of grant of family pension, eligible dependents are parents, spouse and unmarried unemployed daughters of a deceased freedom fighter. Not more than one eligible dependent can be granted pension and in the event of availability of more than one dependent, the sequence of eligibility is widow / widower, unmarried unemployed daughters (upto maximum three such daughters) and parents.

3. A copy of the salient features of the Swatantrata Sainik Samman Pension Scheme, 1980 is enclosed.
