Please refer to your RTI application dated 14/03/2014 addressed to Central Public Information Officer, External Public Relations Personnel, New Delhi, received by Ministry of External Affairs, P.O. Delhi on 10/03/2014. Your request by this Division on 24/03/2014 -

1. Point No. 1, 2, 3 and 4 of your query do not come under the jurisdiction of this Division. The Point No. 1 & 2 are being forwarded to CPIC, Ministry of Defence. Point No. 3 is being forwarded to CPIC, XPR Division of MHA. Point No. 4 is being forwarded to CPIC, Ministry of Home Affairs for further necessary action. Point No. 5 are being forwarded to PIR Division, which is for response regarding Pakistan.

2. The response to other points of your query is as follows -

(i) Point No. 3 No specific archival information regarding the unilateral ceasefire declared by China in 1962 is available with this Division or CPIC.

(ii) Point No. 4 Since 1962 China has occupied approximately 39,000 sq km of territory in the Western Sector of India-China boundary in the state of Jammu & Kashmir. Under the so-called China-Pakistan "Boundary Agreement" of 1963, Pakistan illegally ceded 5,130 sq km of territory in Pakistan Occupied Kashmir to China.

(iii) Point No. 5, 6 During the Chinese Premier's visit to Pakistan in May 2013, the two sides agreed to jointly develop the Long-Term Plan for China-Pakistan Economic Corridor. During the Pakistani Prime Minister's visit to China in July 2013, the two sides agreed to set up a Joint Cooperation Committee on the Long-Term Plan for China-Pakistan Economic Corridor. Roads and other forms of connectivity envisaged in this Economic Corridor would pass through Pakistan Occupied Kashmir. Government is aware that China is executing infrastructure projects in Pakistan Occupied Kashmir. Government has raised this issue with the Chinese side and has clearly conveyed India's consistent position that Pakistan has been in illegal occupation of parts of the Indian State of Jammu and Kashmir since 1947. China regards Kashmir as a bilateral matter to be settled between India and Pakistan. Government has conveyed its concerns to China about their activities in Pakistan Occupied Kashmir and urged them to cease such activities. Respectably, during the State Visit of 2013 by Chinese Premier in May 2013, both sides agreed that "The two sides will not allow their territories to be used for activities against the other side and will be committed to taking a positive view of and supporting each other's relations with other countries." The full text of the Joint Statement issued on this occasion is enclosed.

(iv) Point No. 7 During the visit of the 3rd High Level Border Dialogue to China in June 2011, the two sides agreed to each appoint a Special Representative (SR) to explore from the political perspective of the other's different relationship framework for a country level border talks. There have been seven such rounds of talks. The 1st round took place in New Delhi in January 2012, 2nd round in Beijing in July 2012 and 3rd round in New Delhi in February 2014. In January, 2015, both sides signed a joint declaration on the Establishment of a Working Mechanism on Confidence-Building and Coordination (WMCOC) on India-China Border Affairs. The first meeting of the WMCOC was held in March 2014 in Beijing. The second meeting was held in November 2012 in New Delhi. The 3rd meeting was held in New Delhi in July 2013. 4th meeting was held in Beijing in September 2013 and 5th meeting was held in New Delhi in February 2014. The press releases regarding these meetings are enclosed. Besides WMCOC and diplomatic channels, other established mechanisms include border personnel meetings and flag meetings. (v) Point No. 8 The issuance of visas by India and China is guided by the provisions of the Memorandum of Understanding on Simplifying Visa Procedures between the two governments signed in June 2005, which is being implemented by both sides. Government's position that there should be no discrimination against visa applicants of Indian nationality on grounds of domicile and ethnicity has been clearly conveyed to the Chinese Government on several occasions and at the highest level. Visas issued on a separate sheet of paper stapled to passports are not considered valid for travel out of the country.

3. If you are aggrieved with this reply, you may file an appeal to Shri Shilpek Ambula, DS (China) & Appellate Authority, Ministry of External Affairs, South Block, New Delhi 110011, within a month from the date of receipt of this letter.

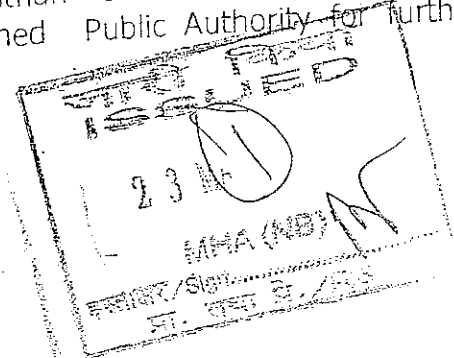
