**Sub: The RFP of even number dated 14.07.2020 floated on CPP Portal and opened on 04.08.2020 (Tech Bid) for evaluation of police stations to select and rank best Police Stations in the country**

A Request for Proposal (RFP) No. 25019/12/2020-PM-II dated 14.07.2020 floated on CPP Portal. The Technical Bids were opened on 04.08.2020. The following five firms participated in the RFP: -

- (i) Grant Thornton
- (ii) National Productivity Council
- (iii) Quality Council of India
- (iv) Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu India LLP
- (v) Karvy Insights limited.

2. The Consultant Evaluation Committee (CEC) under the Chairmanship of Director (PM-II), MHA thoroughly examined the qualification criteria, eligibility criteria and technical parameters of the bids submitted by the respective firms. During the evaluation, it was found that three firms disclosed price bid during the technical bids.

3. On the preliminary examination of bids, the CEC observed the major shortcoming on the part of the following three firms:

As per clause 13.3 of section 2 part 1 at page 15 of RFP, "The technical and financial bids, in prescribed formats and other required documents as per the RFP should be submitted on CPP Portal website i.e. <http://eprocure.gov.in/cppp>. Applicants should furnish/ upload scanned copies of all documents preferably in "pdf" format. The financial bids are to be uploaded only in the prescribed formats and bid of any firm which disclosed any pricing information in technical bid stage will be summarily rejected."
