 - (ii) Statement indicating the Budget Estimates, Revised Estimates and Actual Expenditure for 2019-2020, 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 along with reasons for variations, if any, and variation in percentage between BE (2021-22) & BE (2022-23) and between RE (2021-22) & BE (2022-23);
 - (iii) Annual Report of the Ministry for the year 2021-2022;
 - (iv) Projection of outlays for the schemes to be undertaken by the Ministry during the financial years 2022-23; along with percentage of variation of BE (2022-23) and RE (2021-22);
 - (v) Physical and financial targets fixed and achievements made during the last 3 years along with a note on the targets fixed and achieved;
 - (vi) Details of requirement for 15th Finance Commission (Financial Year 2021-22 to Financial Year 2025-26) in respect of the Ministry along with vision document, if any;
 - (vii) Details of under-utilization of the allocations made under different Heads during the last three years, if any, along with reasons therefor; and
 - (viii) Audit observations made by the CAG, on the matters relating to the Ministry, during 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22, if any, and the action taken thereon.
2. The following papers may also be supplied immediately after the laying of Detailed Demands for Grants of the Ministry in the House:
- (i) Detailed Demands for Grants (2022-2023); and
 - (ii) Outcome Budget of the Ministry for the year (2022-2023)
