- 2. Point wise reply of your application dated 12/6/2014 is furnished below.
 - (i) No such treaty under the Repatriation of Prisoners Act 2003 has been signed by the Government of India with United States of America. However, India has acceded to the Inter-American convention on Serving Criminal Sentences Abroad of the Organisation of American States.
 - (ii) There are total 22 countries with which such Treaty has been signed by the Government of India for the repatriation of prisoners from said countries to India and vice-versa, viz. United Kingdom, Mauritius, Bulgaria, France, Egypt, Sri Lanka, Cambodia, South Korea, Saudi Arabia, Iran, Bangladesh, Brazil, Israel, Bosnia & Herzegovina, UAE, Italy, Turkey, Maldives, Thailand, Russian Federation, Kuwait, Viet Nam.
 - (iii) Total 44 prisoners have been repatriated to India from various countries after the passing of the 2003 Act and no prisoner has been repatriated from United States of America.
- 3. An appeal against this RTI application shall lie before Shri S. Suresh Kumar, Joint Secretary (CS), Ministry of Home Affairs, B Wing, 5th Floor, NDCC-II Building, Jai Singh Road, New Delhi.
