ORDER:

The Government of India have suggested that rifle clubs should be granted all reasonable facilities and their formation encouraged where they are not in existence already. The Madras Govt. have accordingly decided that three rifle clubs may be opened initially in this State, one in Madras City, one in Coimbatore and the third in Villupuram. The necessary license should be obtained from the Board of Revenue, subject to the conditions laid down in G.O. M. 671, Home, dated 20.2.1948. The following paragraphs indicate the line of action to be taken for the formation of the clubs.

1. Officer bearers of rifle clubs: The Collector and the District Superintendent of Police in the mafusseal districts and the Commissioner of Police and a Dy. Commissioner in Madras City, should be the President and Vice-President, respectively of the club. The membership of the club should be thrown open to officials and non-officials. The Police authorities should keep a watchful eye on the membership, as it is easily possible that undesirable persons would resort to rifle clubs to obtain practice in firearms. The President of the club will decide, with reference to the requirements and the facilities obtaining in the locality, the number of days in the week and the hours during which the club should function and other matters connected with the functioning of the club.

2. Arms and ammunition: The clubs should equip themselves at their cost with the necessary arms and ammunition. Six rifles of .22 bore should be sufficient for the use of each club. If any club proposes to import direct from abroad, an application in the annexed form addressed to the Chief Controller of Imports, should be sent to them through this Govt.

3. Storage of arms and ammunition: FIREARMS and ammunition belonging to the club will not be allowed to be stored in police stations; but they can be stored in police armories if there are sufficient accommodation and facilities.

4. Instructions to members:- Police officers of and above the rank of Sub-Inspector, Sergeant, or Sergeant-Major, may be deputed to give instructions in the use of rifles to members of the club. If for any reason it is not possible for the police authorities to give the necessary instructions the help of the Army Commanders may be sought for the purpose.

6. Financial assistance: No club should expect any financial assistance from the Govt. The cost of arms, ammunition and other facilities should be met of the funds of the club, i.e. from the monthly subscription raised from members and donations raised locally. The President should exercise proper control and check over the accounts of the club.

7. The Commissioner of police and the collectors of Coimbatore and Visakhapatnam are requested to make arrangements for opening rifle clubs immediately accordingly and to submit a report, not later than 1.4.53, on the working of the clubs.


Please refer to your RTI application dated 26.07.2013, which was received on 03.09.2013, seeking information under the RTI Act, 2005.
