Please refer to your RTI application dated 25.03.2014 received in the office of undersigned on 28.03.2014 on the above subject.

2 Reply as requested in para 1-6 of the application is as under:

As per Section 5(2) of Indian Telegraph Act 1885 and Indian Telegraph (Amendment) Rules, 2007 interception orders are issued "in the interest of the sovereignty and integrity of India, the security of the State, friendly relations with foreign states or public order or for preventing incitement to the commission of an offence". Disclosure of any details pertaining to lawful interception, either in terms of orders issued by competent authority, or minutes of Review Committee meeting or confirmation whether a particular number is on lawful interception (indirectly by seeking details of diary number/date/covering letter of related communication) could have an adverse effect on security of India and might expose the working of investigative and intelligence agencies. Therefore, the information is immune from disclosure under sub-section 1(a) and 1(g) of Section 8 of RTI Act, 2005.

3. It is informed that in case you are not satisfied with the reply, you can prefer an appeal within 30 days from the receipt of this communication to Shri Rakesh Singh, Joint Secretary (Internal Security-I), Room No 197-B, North Block, Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi, who is the Appellate Authority in this case.
