(b) Another rehabilitation package announced in 2002 for the Displaced persons from PoK of 1947 settled in J&K is enclosed at Annexure-II.



REHABILITATION PACKAGE FOR REFUGEE CAMP IN JAMMU

RURAL SETTLERS

- 2-3 acres of irrigated land or 4 acres of unirrigated land per family (depending on size of the family).
- Rs.1000/- per family as ex-gratia payment.
- For State land allotted, ownership rights were conferred on allottee in 1963.
- For evacuee land allotted, occupancy tenancy rights were given under the Agrarian Reform Act.¹⁴ (These rights are more or less absolute in the sense that the allottee can transfer the right of occupancy tenancy by sale, gift or exchange without permission of Government).
- 46 Huts constructed by rural settlers on their own were regularized under the Slum Improvement Scheme of J & K.

URBAN SETTLERS

- Ex-gratia cash payment of Rs.3500/- per families.
- 1600 residential quarters were constructed and allotted by the Government of Jammu & Kashmir, Udhampur and Bawali. Cost of the structure was deducted from the ex-gratia grant of Rs.3500/- per family.
- To 123 evacuee plots were allotted in Jammu by the State Housing Board free of cost in Paholy Colony of Jammu.

Subject: Grant of relief to Displaced Persons Under Non-acquired
Tenancy at end of lease on 30th December.

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I am directed to state that the matter relating to Demands/Grievances of

Displaced persons from POK had been engaging the attention of the Government of India for quite some time. The Government of India after careful examination of the matter, have now decided to accept four major demands having far reaching implications regarding rehabilitation/relief/assistance to these displaced persons. Accordingly, the approval of the Government of India is hereby granted to the grant of rehabilitation/relief/assistance to these displaced persons from POK occupied Kingdom of Jammu & Kashmir, on the following terms and conditions:


2. 4. (a) ex-gratia payment (Rs. 15,000/- per family) to those displaced persons of Pak occupied Kashmir who were held in Pak captivity during the crucial period between September 1947 and December, 1950.

- (i) Payment of ex-gratia @Rs. 25,000/- per family in respect of those displaced persons who did not stay in camps.
- (ii) Payment of ex-gratia @Rs. 25,000/- per family in respect of those displaced persons in whose case head of the family did not move along with family before flight or after.
- The above ex-gratia payment of Rs. 25,000/- will be subject to the condition that the income of each family at the relevant time did not exceed Rs. 100/- per month. Further more, in cases where the State Government of J&K had not paid cash grant of Rs. 1,000/- per family to rural settlers in the past but allotted land to them, the ~~Rs. 1,000/- cash~~ grant could be scaled down proportionately, to ~~Rs. 1,000/- per family~~.
- II. Payment of cash compensation for land deficiency @Rs 5,000/- per kanal subject to the maximum limit of Rs. 25,000/- per family. The rate of land deficiency @Rs 5,000/- per kanal will be maximum rate and permissible to only those families in whose areas the rate of land is Rs. 5,000/- per kanal or more. Where the cost of the land is less than Rs. 5,000/- per kanal, the payment will be made at the actual prevailing rates in the area.
- III. An amount of ~~Rs. 25,000/-~~ to be provided for the allotment of plots to those displaced persons who have already been settled in the State of J&K and who have not been allotted plots in the past.
- IV. ~~Rs. 25,000/-~~ marks to be provided to the State Government of J&K for implementation of civic amenities in ~~displaced~~ colonies.
- V. To constitute a Committee comprising the officials of the Government of India and the State Government of Jammu and Kashmir to identify, scrutinize the pending claimants eligible for above benefits.
- VI. In cases, where the original claimants have since expired, the ~~original claimants~~ ~~claimants~~ ~~who~~ ~~are~~ ~~still~~ ~~eligible~~ for these benefits, subject to the production of ~~death certificate~~ ~~certificates~~.
3. All the above payments would be subject to an undertaking to be furnished by the beneficiaries that there would be no further claims, whatsoever, and also that the amount received are in full and final settlement of their claims.

4. The State Government will first ~~submit the details~~ mentioned expenditure and then claim reimbursement from the Government of India. For claiming reimbursement, the State Government of J&K will have to produce ~~details~~
~~certified by~~ certificate from the State Accountant General for the actual expenditure incurred by them alongwith full details of families to whom the payment has been made by them. The State Government should also indicate the requirement of fund for making necessary provision in the budget for such reimbursements.

5. This stands with the concurrence of Integrated Finance Division of this Ministry via their Dy No. 5/1/1/A(Fin.IV) dated 9.8.2000.
