Administrators of Union territories to discharge functions of CENTRAL GOVERNMENT IN RESPECT OF FOREIGNERS.

S. R. O. 3531, dated the 31st October, 1957.—In pursuance of clause (1) of article 239 of the Constitution, the President hereby directs that subject to his control, the Administrator for the time being of a Union territory (whether called a Lieutenant-Governor or a Chief Commissioner or an Administrator) shall, in relation to the Union territory concerned, discharge the functions of the Central Government (i) for obtaining an indemnity bond in respect of a foreigner entering India; (ii) for taking any action under the terms and conditions of the bond; and (iii) for incurring any expenditure on the foreigner and his family during their residence in India and on their repatriation out of India.
