ORDER

Shri Subhash Chandra Agarwal has preferred 1st Appeal dated 12.4.2014.

2. The RTI application dated 14.1.2013 of Shri Subhash Chandra Agarwal was received in UTS-I Desk, MHA from UTP Section/US(DP) on 4.4.2014 for providing reply on point no. 1 to 8. Director(S) & CPIO vide this Ministry's letter No. F. 14039/35/2013-UTS-I dated 7.4.2014 furnished the relevant reply to the applicant in regard to the point no. 2,3,5,6 and 8 as per the records available in UTS-I Desk. The RTI application dated 14.1.2013, reply given by the CPIO and the 1st appeal filed by the appellant have been considered. In response to the point no. 5 and 6 of the application dated 14.1.2013, the CPIO had provided the information that some complaints against Shri Neeraj Kumar have been received in the Ministry, which had been processed as per the provisions. The appellant, if he wishes may inspect the relevant file to get the desired information. However, the information regarding sacking of Delhi Police Commissioner was not received in UTS-I Desk. As regard to the other points i.e. 2,3, and 8 which relates to the UTS-I Desk, the CPIO has already provided the reply as available in UTS-I Desk. However, copies of complaints against Shri Neeraj Kumar are enclosed.

3. The appeal filed by Shri Subhash Chandra Agarwal has been carefully considered and it is found that the aforesaid reply/decision of the CPIO with reference to his application dated 14.1.2013 is in conformity with the Right to Information Act, 2005.

4. The appeal is accordingly disposed of.

Complete information together with related correspondence/file-notings/documents on action taken on each and every aspect of my submissions 'Delhi Police at High Court: Mindset and apology' (PRSEC/E/2013/00617) dated 11.01.2013 by President Secretariat and/or by public-authority where these submissions have been forwarded by President Secretariat
2. Is it true that some fifteen personalities including Shri CV Narsimhan, Shri BS Raghavan, Admiral L Ramdas, Shri SP Ambrose, General VK Singh, Shri MR Sivaraman, Lt. General Prakash Katoch, Shri M.G.Devasahayam, Major General Ashok Kalyan Verma, Arun Kumar, Brigadier V. Mahalingam, Shri M. Raman, Col. Karan Kharb, Shri Rajivan Krishnaswamy and Col. K. Maliappan have written some letter dated 27.12.2012 to Honourable President of India making allegations against Delhi Police Commissioner Shri Neeraj Kumar?
3. Copy of the said letter (with annexures) as referred in query (2) above with complete information together with related file-notings/correspondence/documents etc on action taken on each and every aspect of the said letter either by President's Secretariat and/or public-authority where the said letter might have been forwarded
4. Has cognizance been taken by concerned ones at President Secretariat and/or concerned public-authorities like also Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) on news-reports like enclosed ones where insensitivity and poor performance of Delhi Police in handling angered protest on infamous gang-rape incident is even confessed by Delhi Police itself at Delhi High Court as also criticised bitterly by Delhi Chief Minister?
